We celebrate Labor Day on the first Monday of September. The first state to pass a law recognizing Labor Day observance was Oregon on February 21, 1887. The United States Congress would make Labor Day a national day to recognize the contributions and achievements of the America work force on June 28, 1894. A part of our American culture states, "If you work hard, you will achieve your dreams." It has been a part of our national mindset to value the worth of work. But this is changing in our modern era.
